News from Birch Class

This week, our history lessons have been centered around the life of the Ancient Egyptians. We examined images of ancient artefacts, which provided intriguing insights into the daily lives, beliefs, and cultural practices. In our Geography lessons we have been exploring the nature of different sized settlements.

We have carried out a number of assessments this week and children have worked hard to show me what they know and also help us to plan future lessons around what your children need to know.

Thank you for your work at home with your child to rehearse their lines, if they have them, for our KS2 Christmas Service next Tuesday. We are dealing with any costumes in class so there is no need to rush out and buy fancy dress! Children are to come in their school uniform please to both the morning and evening service.

Next week we will be focusing on multiplication and division in our Maths lessons and in our English lessons we are concentrating on factual writing. Reading Dorling Kindersley style non-fiction books can help children become familiar with this style of writing.

News from Hazel Class

In English we have started looking at instructions and creating a guide to make a roman soldier as Davey did in the Roman Beanfeast.

So far we have thought carefully about what features need to be in an instructional text and had a practice at writing instructions that use imperative verbs, adverbs and fronted adverbials.

Next week we will continue with instruction writing.

In Maths we have still been thinking about multiplication and division; how known facts

can help us solve what at first would seem challenging calculations, but with a bit of thinking and application of known facts, turns out to be not so tricky after all, eg, g 36 x 5=

In Science we have had another think about electricity and electrical circuits. We have learnt some of the standardised symbols used to draw a diagram of an electrical circuit, created circuits with a switch to light a bulb and started a design for a simple electrical lamp.



In some other lessons:-

We have assessed our learning of this half term's topics. We were all pleased with how much we had learnt and enjoyed talking about all the fun learning we have done.



Next week we will be applying some of our developed skills to Christmas activities.

Please over the weekend practise any lines that are needed for the church service on Tuesday. Rehearsals have gone very well so far.

News from Yew Class

This week, in Maths, we have finished our unit on multiplication and division. Our next unit will be working on fractions.

In English, we are continuing with our unit of work based on the Australian book 'Where the Forest Meets the Sea.' We analysed a persuasive text about deforestation, worked on adverbs of possibility and looked at converting nouns and adjectives into verbs by using suffixes. We are now at the point of writing a persuasive text based on deforestation and the cutting down of rainforests.

We have also finished our six Year 5 assessments in Reading, Maths and SPAG (spellings, punctuation and grammar) this week. The children worked well and some even enjoyed doing these tests with the Maths papers coming out as the favourite for the class.

Earlier in the week the class had a run through, with the rest of Key Stage 2, of the Christmas Service. Another one is scheduled for Monday with the two services taking place next Tuesday at 9.15am and 5.30pm. For the evening service the children will need to be back at school at 5.00pm please.

There will be no spelling homework set this week but there will be 3 Mathletics tests to complete. There will be a test on the 3 areas that we have completed this term (place value, addition and subtraction, and multiplication and division). Also keep on reading and learning those times tables please.
