News from Acorn Class

This week we learnt about the importance of Remembrance Day by learning what is meant by 'Lest We Forget' and we took part in a minutes silence with the whole school at the war memorial in Steeple Morden. We were quiet and respectful and thought about all of the soldiers that gave their lives for us to have the lives we have today.



We continued our learning on transport by looking at boats and how they float. We made paper boats and completed an experiment with water to see if our boats would float. Unfortunately, when they got wet they ripped and sank. So we made paper boats again, but this time we coloured our paper with wax crayon before folding it into a boat. This time the boats floated! We learnt that this is because the wax crayon makes the paper waterproof. This week we have learnt the following sounds: y, z/zz, qu

and ch. In Maths, we have been looking at adding 'one more' to numbers up to 5.

Please remember to bring book bags into school every day. Inside your child's book bag should be their homework folder with their school reading book, library book, graphemes (sounds) and harder to read and spell words. We use these homework folders at different points throughout the week so they do need to be in school all

week. Thank you for your help with this.

The children are enjoying visiting the library each week. They will need to bring their library book into school on a MONDAY if they would like to swap it for another book. This book is for parents to read to children.

As the weather is getting colder, it is a good idea for children to be wearing layers. We go outside A LOT and if the children do not choose to go outside the door is still open so tights under dresses and skirts, vests under polo shirts are all welcomed. Please can we make sure that every child has a coat <u>and</u> jumper or cardigan in school every day.



Show and Tell this week was the Bananas and they were brilliant! Next week it is the turn of the Oranges. The theme is: Transport; so anything that goes!

This week in Birch class we have been exploring a book where a mysterious creature, similar to a newt, is found in a pond. We have been developing our own description using descriptive devices, such as similes.

In Maths we continue to pay attention to the conventions on setting out addition and subtraction calculations in column format and have stressed the importance of this to help calculation errors that could be easily avoided. In Art, we have been focusing on looking carefully when we are drawing and how to achieve different tone to produce form in art when drawing still life. It was good to see some children had applied their learning at home and used their cross hatching skills when making their spots for Children in Need day.

News from Hazel Class

In English, we started our work based on the book called 'The Roman Bean feast'; a rather entertaining tale of a boy called Davey, who wants to win the Roman prize in a school competition, however his 'know it all' neighbour and peer, wishes to win the prize herself. Not only does Davey have to cope with Molly the neighbour, but his Dad is away and Mum is left at home juggling toddler twins whilst trying to help Davey with his Roman project.

We will be using this story to help us write diary entries; so far we have thought about how Davey feels, ordered the events in the story and listed useful fronted adverbials.

In Maths, we have stated our new unit based on multiplication and division, already we are seeing the importance of knowing our times tables. We have tried using them to solve simple problems and calculations involving a multiplication between a two digit number and a one digit number eg, 19x3. Work on this will continue again next week. In other lessons;

In Science, we have started work on electricity, we have investigated making a simple circuit to light a bulb along with materials that are insulators and conductors of electricity. We will develop our understanding next week.

In this half term's Art work we will be looking at still life. This week we found out what a still life is and a little about how long it has formed a discipline within art.



Geography, we are looking at settlements, so far we have compared hamlets, villages and cities.

In History we have been finding out about life in Ancient Rome, we have considered how large an empire Rome had and how the Romans managed to create it.

Our PE lessons are now Monday and Friday so no earrings Monday or Friday please.

All in all it has been a very exciting, and a very busy, week in Year 6. Alongside all our usual learning opportunities, some year 6 and year 5 children were lucky enough to attend a netball tournament on Tuesday afternoon at Bassingbourn Primary School with Mrs Weddepohl. They were polite, showed good sporting behaviour and played some very good netball! Well done to everyone who attended and represented the School so well.

On Wednesday, it was the turn of our mathematicians to enter a competition and represent the School. Four children from our class attended a Maths competition in Letchworth where they spent their afternoon puzzling over some very challenging questions. They showed great resilience and applied their mathematical knowledge and understanding carefully and appropriately, well done.

Back in the classroom, we continued working on our new text for this half term, 'Skellig, by David Almond. This week we considered the text as readers and discussed the purpose, intended audience and our emotional reactions to the writing. On Wednesday, we also had the opportunity to use drama to help us engage more fully with the text, an experience that we really enjoyed.

In Maths, we have spent time this week working on division, including the often-dreaded long division. From a tentative start, we made good progress and will continue to revisit this method throughout the year as necessary. There will be some activities linked to this on Mathletics this week.

Finally, we just wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for supporting your children to make such a positive start with the weekly homework that is being set for them in their CGP books. The majority of children have returned to school this week having completed the work set, in addition to their weekly spellings, which is a promising foundation for the work that lies ahead. Please pack the homework folders into school bags on Sunday evening as we need to use both CGP books in a lesson on Monday.
