

News from Acorn Class

What an exciting and busy first half term at school we have all had! We have made new friends, learnt new routines, learnt 23 phonemes (a few digraphs thrown in) and 12 Harder To Read and Spell words, discovered the wonder of numbers to 5 and learnt about the properties of everyday 3D shapes, explored our indoor and outdoor environments and participated in a few new playground games. No wonder we are all exhausted and need an autumn half term break!



This week in Phonics the children learnt the graphemes h, b, f, l and the digraphs ff and ll. The children tried hard with learning their new Harder To Read and Spell words 'as' and 'his.' We have been really impressed with how well the children are doing with their oral blending and using their segmenting skills for spelling. Next half term are looking forward to increasing their phonic knowledge and providing opportunities for the children to demonstrate their understanding with the wonder of writing. In Maths this week the children have been building their awareness of the properties of shape, particularly 3D shapes. They

have been amazing at using clear mathematical vocabulary such as roll, stack, curved, round, flat, faces to describe features of shapes and we have even had shape experts naming 3D shapes such as cube, cylinder, pyramid and cone!

Acorn Class have been incredibly busy going on an autumn walk to collect items to create an autumnal collage, reviewing their learning about autumn with Miss Smith, thinking about how they welcome people into the class in PSHE and reviewing their learning about why the word God is important to Christians in RE. 'Show and Tell' this week was the Grapes group and they completed the All about me topic with a flourish! Please see your Year Ahead Booklet for your child's next Show and Tell date.
