




Milton Country Park Cross Country Competition



In English and Maths, we have worked very hard on assessments applying all of our learning from Years three and four.

In Geography we took on the role of town planners and in groups designed and built our own towns. In Art we looked carefully at the work of Paul Cézanne, focussing on his still life of fruit. We have also found out the meaning behind advent, some of the traditions behind this time and how it is celebrated. Mrs Holley (with some helpers) made an advent wreath for the whole school to share.

News from Yew Class

This week, in Maths, we have looked at multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. We have almost finished this unit and our next unit, which we will start before the Christmas break will be fractions.

In English, we are continuing with our unit of work based on the Australian book 'Where the Forest Meets the Sea.' We read and listened to a poem called 'There's a 'Rang-Tan' in my bedroom' and discussed all of the emotions that it made us feel (which were very varied) and looked at evidence to back this up.

This week the class started to work through some of the Year 5 assessments. The tests will focus on Reading, Maths and SPAG (spellings, punctuation and grammar). These will continue into next week as well.



News from Oak Class

In Maths this week, we have continued our work on fractions; ordering and comparing fractions firstly using the denominators, then the numerators. We then moved onto adding and subtracting fractions using a variety of methods.

It is now time in English to bring together all that we have been learning this half term about creating atmosphere, suspense and tension in our own extended piece of writing. We spent the early part of the week carefully deciding on a suitable setting and then generating and gathering words, phrases and examples of figurative language that would help us when writing. As the week progressed, we then began to carefully write, edit and refine a piece of work that would demonstrate our understanding of all that we had learnt.

In Science, we have continued to deepen our understanding of the human circulatory system by looking at the structure and function of blood and blood vessels. We have started to research where blood is made, what it is made of, what it carries around the body and blood groups. The children are working hard to present their findings clearly to the rest of the class using a PowerPoint presentation that will be shared with the class next week.



In Geography we have been travelling around the world studying different mountain ranges, from the Andes to the Appalachians, from the Himalayas to the Ethiopian Highlands. We now have a much clearer understanding of what we mean when we read that mountains are 'young' or 'old' and how their age affects their elevation about sea level. We found out that Mount Kilimanjaro is not part of a mountain range at all – it stands alone.

We have been hearing the younger children in school rehearsing for their Nativity next week and we too have been discussing preparations for our Church Carol Concert on Tuesday 17th December. There are two concerts – one at 9.15am and one at 5.30pm. We would like all children to return to school to walk to church for the evening candlelit service and would be very grateful if you could let us know if this will not be possible for any reason for your child. Children need to be back in school by 5.00pm. Year 6 will be singing carols and some children have readings that they will bring home to practise. Have a lovely weekend.
