

* For sickness and/or diarrhea it is essential to keep your child away from school **until 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea/vomiting**. Please remember if your child is unwell they will be much more comfortable at home with a parent or carer who can look after them much more closely than we can in school.

Symptoms of respiratory infections, including COVID-19

Respiratory infections can spread easily between people. It is important to be aware of symptoms so you can take action to reduce the risk of spreading your infection to other people. The symptoms of COVID-19 and other respiratory infections are very similar. It is not possible to tell if you have COVID-19, flu or another respiratory infection based on symptoms alone. Most people with COVID-19 and other respiratory infections will have a relatively mild illness, especially if they have been vaccinated.

If you have symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as COVID-19, and you have a high temperature or you do not feel well enough to go to work or carry out normal activities, you are advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

Symptoms of COVID-19, flu and common respiratory infections include:

- continuous cough
- high temperature, fever or chills
- loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell
- shortness of breath
- unexplained tiredness, lack of energy
- muscle aches or pains that are not due to exercise
- not wanting to eat or not feeling hungry
- headache that is unusual or longer lasting than usual
- sore throat, stuffy or runny nose
- diarrhoea, feeling sick or being sick

We've had a fun week in the sun! The children were fantastic at Sports Day. We are very proud of their resilience and bravery as well as their sportsmanship.





Firstly, thank you to all the parents, carers and grandparents that came to support the children on Wednesday for sports morning. The children had a fantastic time and were very proud of their individual and house achievements. The Year 2 teaching team were looking out for 4 characteristics of good Olympians and were delighted to see so many Year 2 children being courageous, inspiring each other, respecting all participants and being determined to be the best they can be.


News from Peacock Class (Year 3)

In English, we have continued working on our diary writing. In Maths, we concluded our work on time by adding and subtracting times, in order to solve real life problems, as well as telling time to the minute in order to work out durations of time. News from Heron Class (Year 5)


Thank you to everyone who was able to come into school and support us for our Sports Day on Thursday morning. At last, the sun came out and we all enjoyed cheering one another on and spending time together outside of the classroom. Well done to all of those competitors who excelled in their events and also congratulations to everyone who took part even though it is not their favourite day of the year! We are proud of you all.

In Maths this week, we have continued with our work on co-ordinates, plotting shapes and solving problems. We have also begun to translate shapes, once again using co-ordinates.

In English, we have begun to write our explanation texts. We are explaining the development of African-American music from 1890 to 1990; this work is linked to our Geography topic this term - North America. We have listened to various musical extracts from all four musical genres and thought about how the music makes us feel, the instruments that have been used to create the sound and what socio-political issues the

music was reflecting in North America at that time. As ever, your children have handled discussion of these big issues with maturity and curiosity and are producing interesting pieces of writing as a result.

Finally, in P.S.H.E. this week we have begun to explore our body's physical 'Early Warning Systems', the ways that our bodies communicate to us that they do not feel safe in a particular circumstance or environment. Our aim is to be able to articulate what these warning signs are for each of us individually and then to think about places that we do and do not feel safe across a range of environments.



If you have not yet seen the document that came home with your child this week about Bikeability please do have a rummage in their bag for it. Our Bikeability course starts on Monday 1st July and lasts until Thursday 4th July inclusive. Your child will need their bike, in a roadworthy condition, in school every day during this period and they **must** bring and wear a helmet to take part in the course. <u>No one who attends without a helmet will be</u> <u>allowed to take part</u>.
